

2021 Annual Legal Update Continuing Legal Education (CLE) FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

>> What can I do to ensure I receive full CLE credit in Ohio for attending this webinar?

- 1. Login to Zoom via the link in your email at least 5 minutes prior to the start of the program (10:30 am) or the start of the session you wish to attend. A copy of the full agenda has been emailed to you and can be found at kmklaw.com under the "News & Resources" tab.
- 2. Write down **ALL** of the codes that are given during the webinar on the CLE Cheat Sheet form. These will be mostly at the beginning, halfway point, and end of each segment. You will be <u>required</u> to provide these in the survey/evaluation in order to receive CLE credit.
- 3. Complete the <u>required</u> survey/evaluation at the end of the webinar or when you receive it via email by December 10th (please only complete the survey/evaluation once).

>>> Can I watch the webinar in a conference room with a group of attorneys?

No. For CLE credit, all participants will be required to log in individually using the email address provided at registration. Attendance will be monitored throughout the program using codes which will be given throughout the event and then individually reported in the survey/evaluation.

KMK will report each attorneys attendance in OH & IN by **December 23rd**. Please note that KMK has 30 days after the program to report attendance. If you have not received your Certificates of Attendance and/or your attendance has not been reported after December 23rd, please contact Sarah Schmidt (see below for contact information).

>>> How do I report my attendance in KY?

- 1. Go to www.kybar.org
- 2. Click on the yellow **CLE** button.
- 3. Sign in by clicking on the yellow Member CLE Portal button.
- 4. Select Submit New Credits.
- 5. Make sure the **7/1/2021 to 6/31/2022** Educational Year and the **Live or On Demand** is selected (the form defaults to these selections).



- 6. Enter the Program Number (will be provided at the end of the program) and select the Program Name (KMK Law Annual Legal Update). Please be patient as it will take a moment for the program names to load.
- 7. Click **Next** and enter the **Total CLE Credits** (5.75 total hours possible) you have earned of the Program's accredited CLE hours. You will also need to **Enter** the number of **Ethics** credits (1.5 hours possible) you have earned.
- 8. Add your name and 12/9/2021, then click Next.
- 9. Your credits will automatically appear on your transcript. Please **do not** send paperwork to the KBA.

>>> Can I obtain partial credit for attending only 6 of the 7 sessions?
